From the Desk of Town Supervisor (Pat Flynn):

- Town of Torrey signed a 5 year contract with the Town of Benton for water as well as operation and maintenance for Water District 1 at the June 11th meeting.
- Town of Torrey continues to work with the Village of Dresden in finalizing a water agreement for the Perry Point Water District
- Clark Patterson Lee (CPL) engineering continues to work on obtaining the necessary easements with individual property owners in Water District 1as well as with the railroad. This is necessary before final plans can be drawn for the main water line.
- Steve Griffin of Yates County IDA held a hearing on the proposed Greenidge Data Center on August 20th regarding the Payment In Lieu of Taxes (PILOT)

From the Desk of Town Highway Superintendent (Tim Chambers):

- Off hours emergency callout number: 315-729-2706
- Town Highway Department received \$15,000 from New York State for extreme winter weather. The money was used to pave the area around the Town Building.
- With Town Board approval the Highway Department purchased a new side mower for \$11,500. While awaiting it to arrive the old mower is being used although it often needs repair.
- Using Consolidated Local and Highway Improvement Program (CHIPs) funds Davy and Larzelere Roads were oiled in July and swept in August.
- Normal highway, shoulder, and drainage ditch work is ongoing.
- An erosion issue on East Leach Road continues to be investigated
- Reminder according to NYS law:
 - + throwing trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or refuse on Highways and adjacent lands is <u>prohibited</u>

+ the town superintendent of highways shall sue for and recover a penalty not to exceed \$100 from any person depositing ashes, snow, ice, stones, sticks, etc. upon a highway or on grass or loose stones adjoining a town highway

From the Desk of Town Watershed Inspector (Yates Cty Soil & Water)
The Town's inspectors can be contacted at the Yates County Soil and Water
Conservation Department 315-536-5188.

The Yates County Soil and Water Conservation District provides the watershed inspection services for the Town of Torrey and Village of Dresden. Educating homeowners on the function of their wastewater treatment systems has proven to be a tremendous benefit.

District staff have conducted 377 watershed inspections over the course of the past 5 years since the inception of the Town's Wastewater Law. Of the 377 total inspections, 39 resulted in failures. Failures ranged from something as simple as an alarm float to an entirely new absorption area.

Zone 1 inspections occur every 5 years on properties whose components are within 200 feet of Seneca Lake or a DEC classified stream. There are 33 properties remaining to be inspected to complete the first round of Zone 1 inspections. Round two of Zone 1 inspections will begin in 2020. The District will mail letters to home owners in April as a reminder that their system is due for inspection. Home owners may then let their septic pumpers know that they are in need of a Zone 1 inspection and the pumpers will arrange a time with our office for the inspection.

If any residents have questions regarding the watershed inspection program, they may call the office at 315-536-5188.

Soil & Water also continues to interact with all of our local farmers utilizing NYS's Agricultural Environmental Management program. This program has been utilized in the county since 1997. We have worked with local farmers on a suite of practices including soil erosion and field runoff, manure storage, barnyard runoff, and manure and nutrient management.

An educational workshop was held in July with our local farms discussing environmental issues on farmsteads and manure applications to cropland with good attendance and discussions. Two grants were secured for \$20,000 to construct

additional soil erosion and runoff control structures on farmland in the Town of Torrey. A grant was submitted to NYS for additional agricultural projects in the Town of Torrey totaling \$344,000. Projects include manure storage, field erosion and runoff control, and control of drift in vineyard sprayers.
